iMotoneige is a mobile application for smartphones and tablets designed to accompany you on all your winter adventures.

Developed in partnership with Wepoint, iMotoneige provides quick and comprehensive access to all snowmobile trails in Quebec even without a data plan or cellular signal.

Available in French and English, iMotoneige adapts to your device's language. It is optimised for use in portrait mode but can also be displayed in full screen in landscape mode.

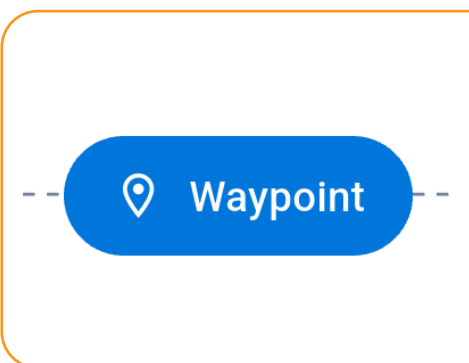
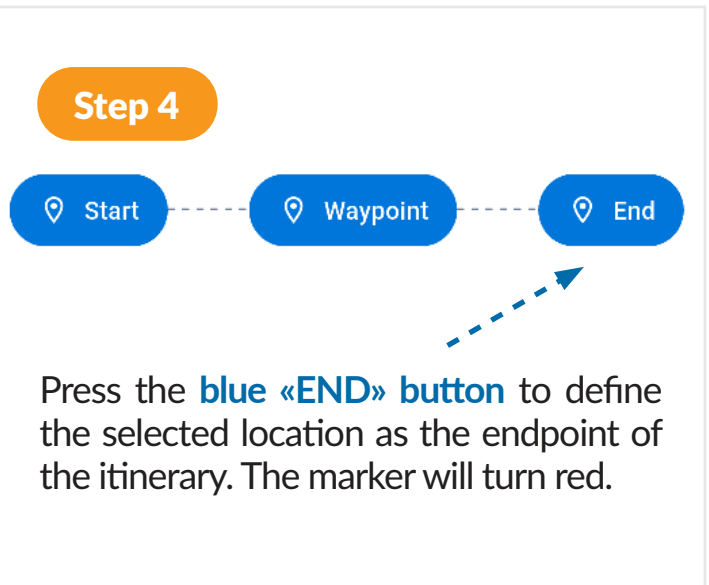
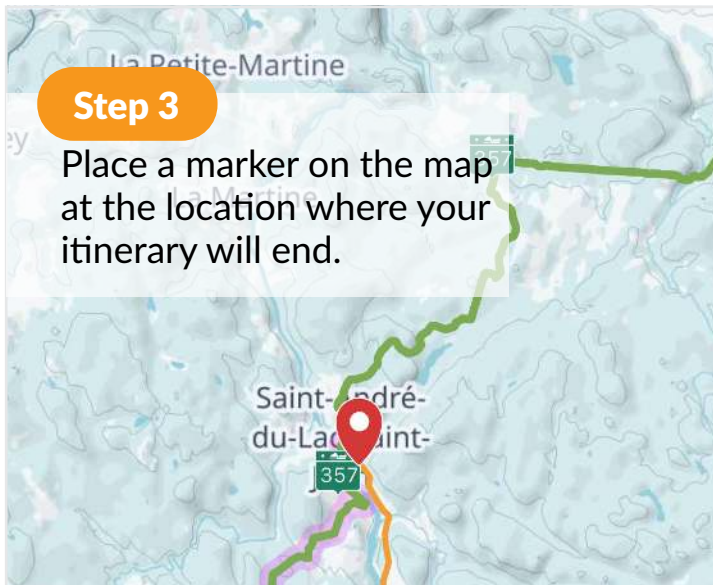
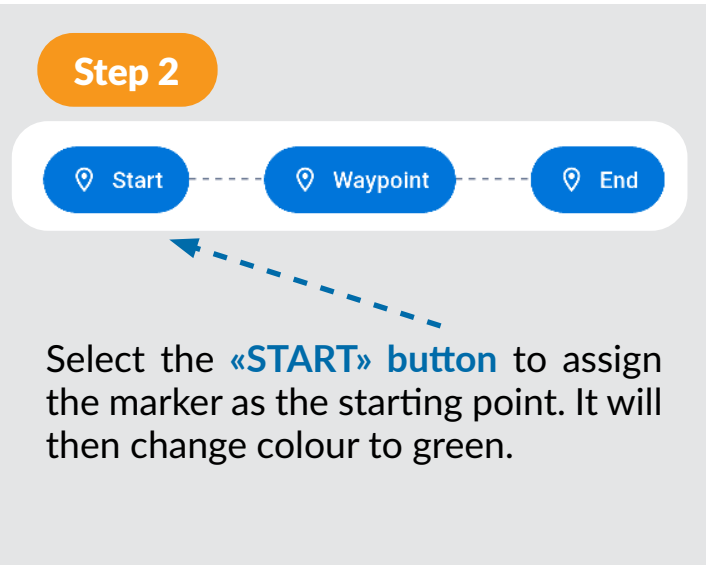
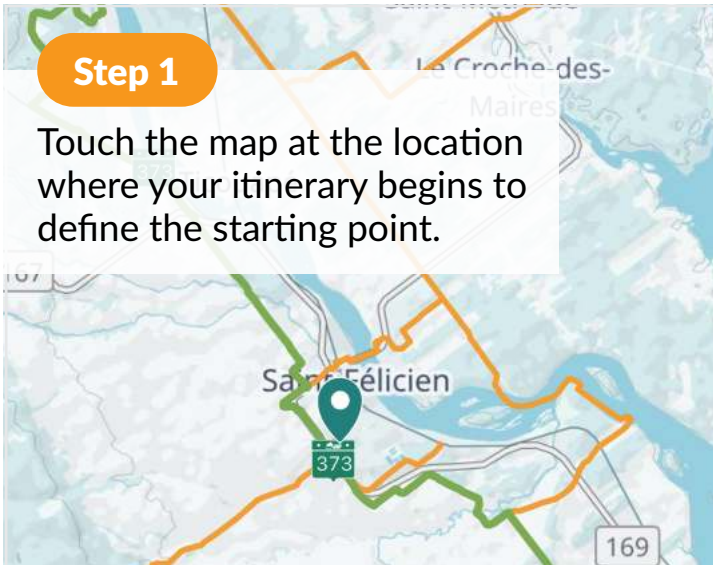


The iMotoneige application allows you to :

- View snowmobile trail routes
- See your real-time position on the trails
- Check trail status (open or closed)
- View the date of the last grooming
- Track groomer movements on open trails
- Visualize snow accumulation on the ground
- Locate businesses registered with Regional Tourism Associations (ATR): accommodations, restaurants, dealerships, etc.
- Find secure hotels, clubhouses, shelters, and FCMQ member clubs
- View information sheets of establishments
- Create your personalised itinerary and share it via email or text message
- Identify the club responsible for the trail you are using

2- Create your itinerary

The application allows you to create personalised itineraries by adding markers for the starting point, stops (points of interest), and the endpoint of the itinerary.



TIP:
Use the “**WAYPOINT**” button to add points of interest to your itinerary, such as a restaurant, gas station, or shelter.

These steps can also be used to modify the trajectory of your itinerary.

2- Create your itinerary - continued

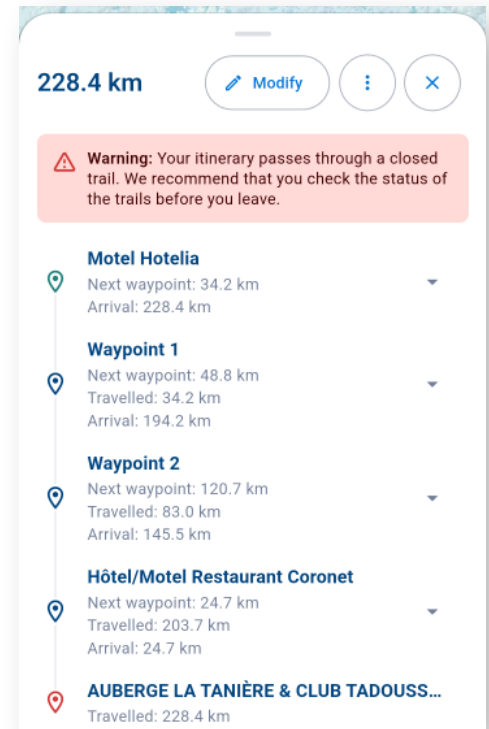
Click on **"ITINERARY"** to view the **details of your route**, modify it, or share it.

Scroll through the tab to fully open it, or simply tap the **gray bar** at the top.

The details of your route will be displayed, including the corresponding distances. The application informs you of the number of kilometres remaining before the next stop, the total distance travelled, and the number of kilometres left before the end of the route.

Attention:

A red message box will appear to warn you when your itinerary includes a closed trail.



The small arrow to the right of the steps allows you to display more details about the distances between each step of your itinerary.

Modify your itinerary


When you press **“MODIFY”**, the mode remains active until you press it again to deactivate it. **The button turns gray when active.**




 **Modifier**


 Touch and drag the three lines to **rearrange the steps** of your itinerary.


 Touch the **trash icon to remove** a step from the itinerary.


 Press the circular icon containing three small dots, located to the left of the X, to display options.

Reverse steps for the return trip



Press **“REVERSE ORDER”** to plan your return route. The selected steps will be reversed: the start will become the end, and the end will become the start. Convenient for the return journey!

Delete your itinerary



Press **“DELETE ITINERARY”** to delete your current itinerary and start a new one.

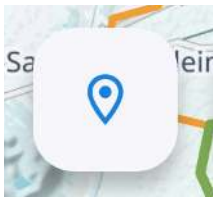
A confirmation box will appear to validate the deletion of the itinerary. You can then choose to **cancel** or **delete**.

3 - Check out the points of interest



Touch the button at the top right of the map to view **points of interest**:

- restaurants
- secure hotels*
- accommodations
- gas stations, etc.

When a box is checked, the corresponding locations appear on the map. You can then click on the location you are interested in and press the **“STEP” button to add it as a stop to your itinerary.**

*A hotel recognized as secure by the FCMQ must offer a security system for snowmobiles such as: Garage, enclosure, camera, guard, or chain (free of charge).

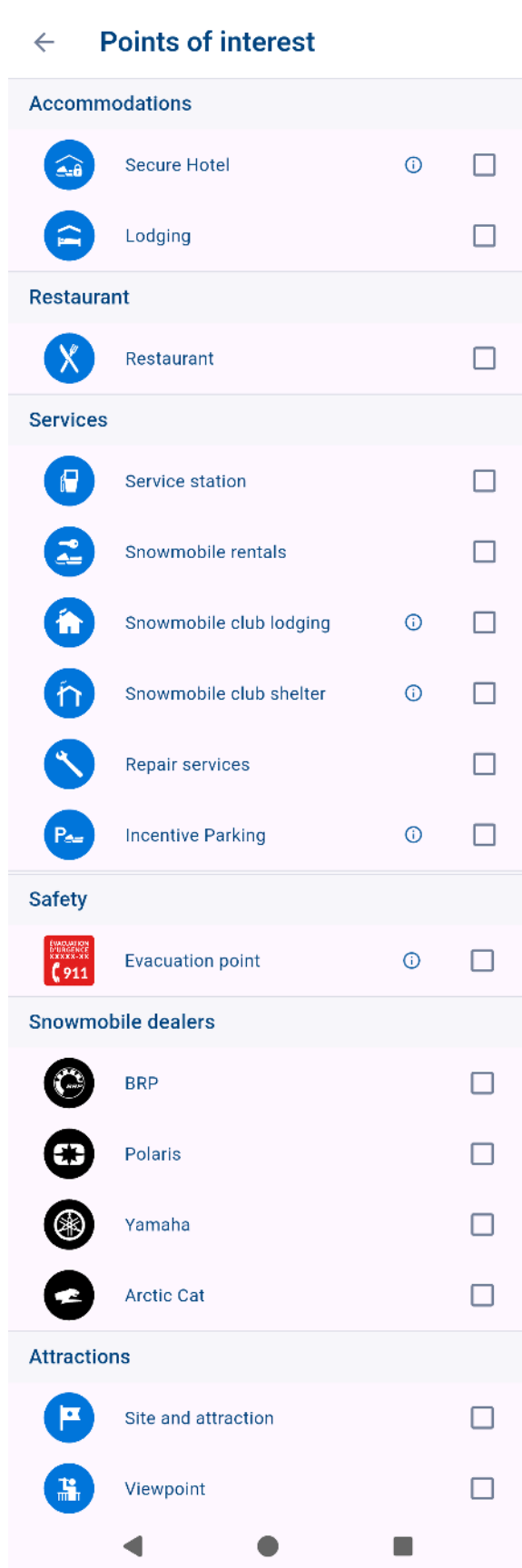
Touch the button at the top left of the map to search for specific places, such as:

- businesses

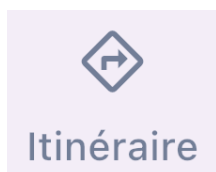

4 - Share your itinerary



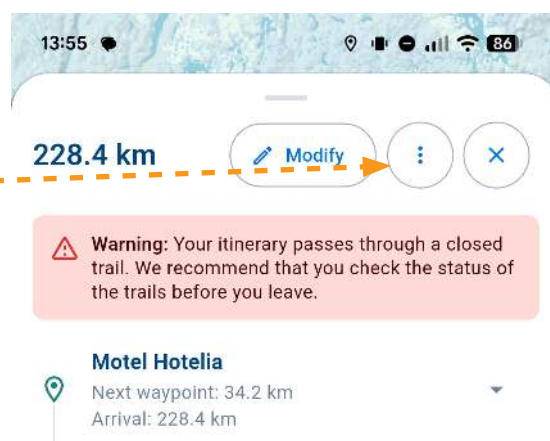
Before starting your journey, take a few minutes to share your itinerary with a loved one or group members.

This simple habit can make all the difference in case of an emergency: it facilitates emergency interventions and allows your loved ones to know where you are.

Sharing your itinerary is also an excellent way to plan outings with friends, coordinate stops, and fully enjoy the experience without worry.

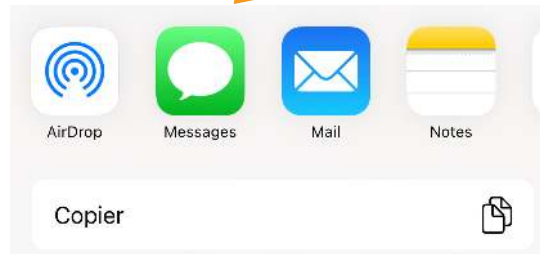
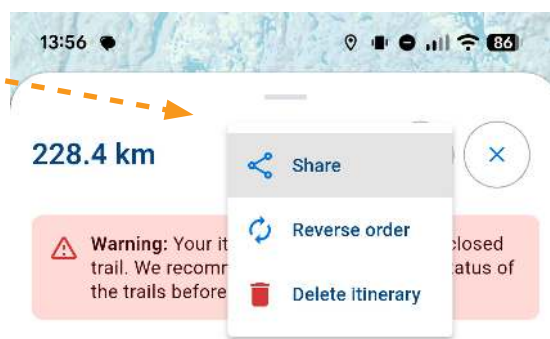
The first option allows you to **share your itinerary** in various ways.



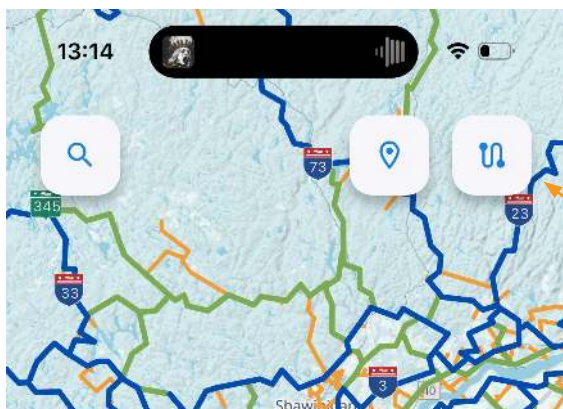
By pressing **"SHARE"**, a new window opens to present the different sharing options:

- social networks or others...

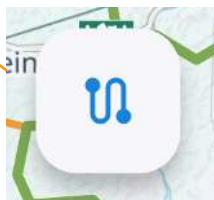
You can also copy the URL link and paste it to send it as you wish.



5 - Check trail status



You can check trail types and their status (open or closed). To start, press the button to display trail options at the top right of the screen.

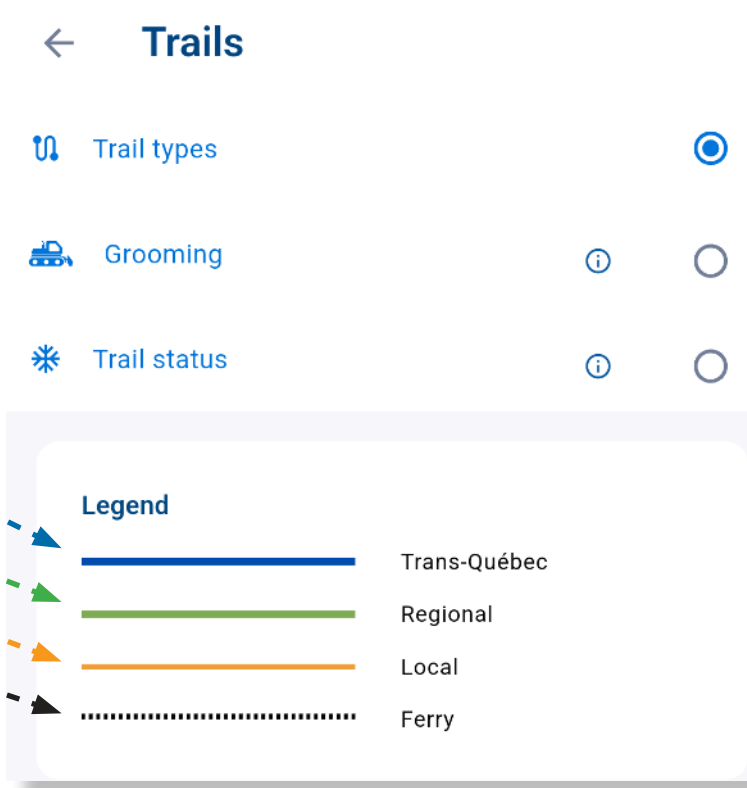


Trail types

Simply check the associated circle to display information about trail types.

Trail types indicate whether they are:

- Trans-Québec (in blue)
- regional (in green)
- local (in orange)
- river crossings (dotted lines)



Definition of trail types

Trans-Québec Trail: This trail is characterised by crossing a minimum of 3 administrative regions of the FCMQ, also considering a provincial or state border as a region.

Regional Trail: This trail is characterized by crossing 3 municipal entities or 2 regional counties (MRC), also considering a provincial or state border as an entity.

Local Trail: This trail is characterised by providing access to a service or being a collector trail for Trans-Québec or regional trails. There is no numbering determined by the FCMQ for this trail.

Trail status



When you check **“TRAIL STATUS”**, the map indicates whether trails are open or closed: **trails in green are open**, and **those in red are closed**.

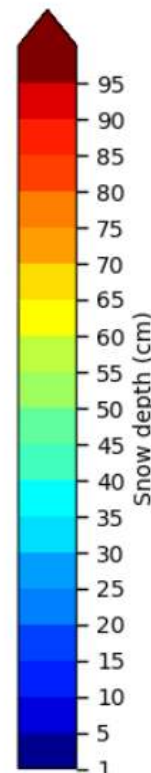

Snow on the ground

An option allows you to view the amount of snow accumulated on the ground on the map using a colour-coded tool.

Simply check the box to activate the feature.

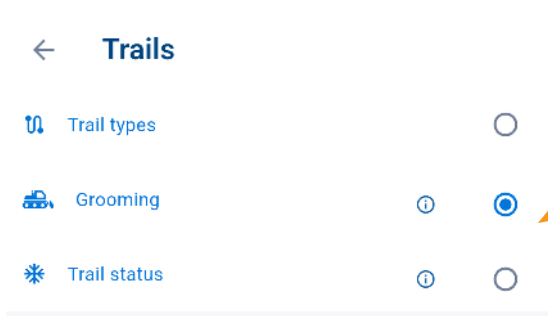

See the location of the Groomers



The trail menu allows you to view trail status and the activity of groomers. You can see where groomers have passed on open trails. Due to data update delays, the groomer icon does not show the exact location of the machine on the ground, but be aware, it is in the vicinity. If a groomer remains stationary or its GPS signal is not detected for more than 15 minutes, it will no longer be visible on the map.



When the **circle is filled**, the function is activated and you will see **colours on the map indicating the time since the groomer passed**. Refer to the legend for the **colour code**. The more recent the pass, the darker the colour! The grooming delay colour updates when the trail is mostly groomed.

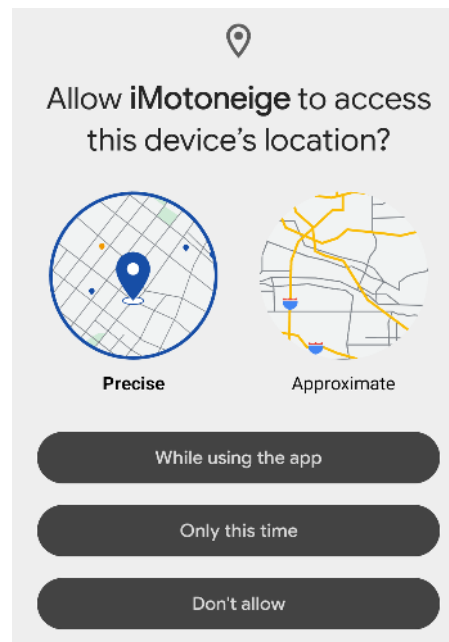
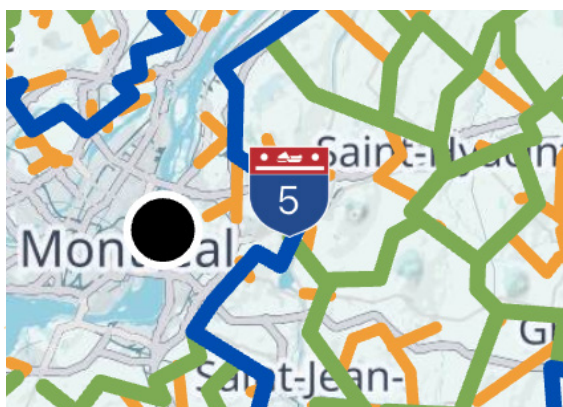
7 - Location

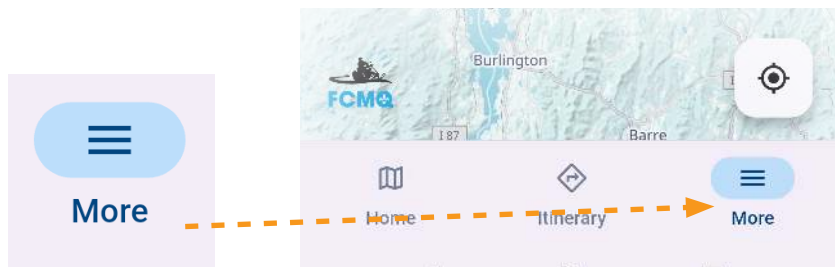


The app allows you to view your position on the trails, to optimise your experience. Make sure you have granted access to your location.

Tap the **target at the bottom of the map** to see your current position on the trails.

A black dot shows your position on the map.





The "MORE" menu includes:

- **MEASUREMENT**, which allows you to change the application's measurement unit (kilometers or miles).
- **MANAGE MY SUBSCRIPTION** opens an external page linking to your Apple or Google account.
- **RESOURCES** allows you to:
 - display the welcome message
 - display the legal notices
 - display the terms of use
 - download the map for access even without a network connection on the trails.

Prevent screen lock

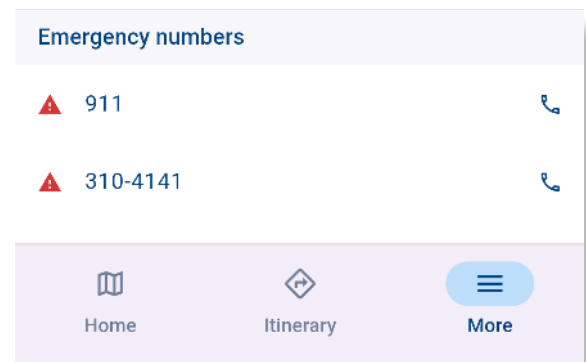
An option also allows you to **prevent the screen from locking** by checking a box. This feature keeps the application open, facilitating continuous navigation on the trails.

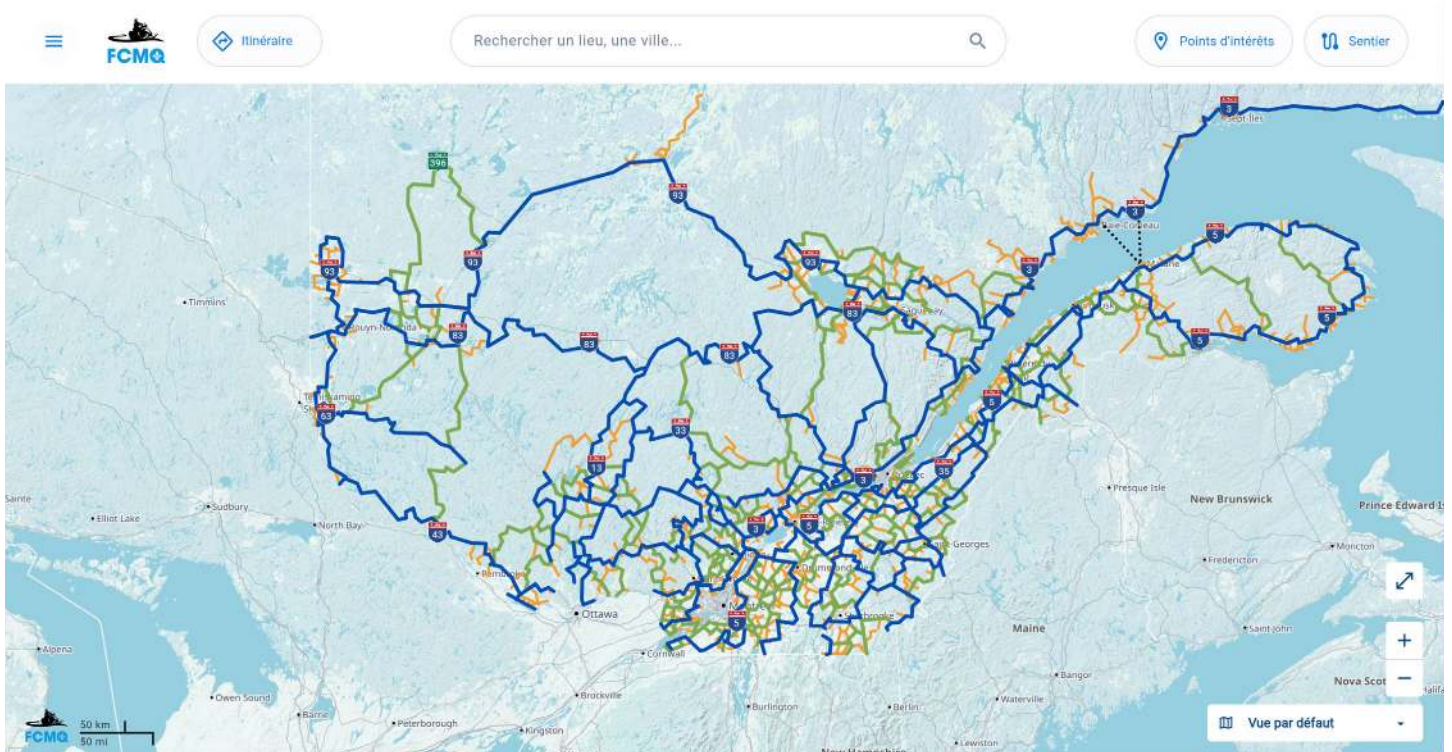

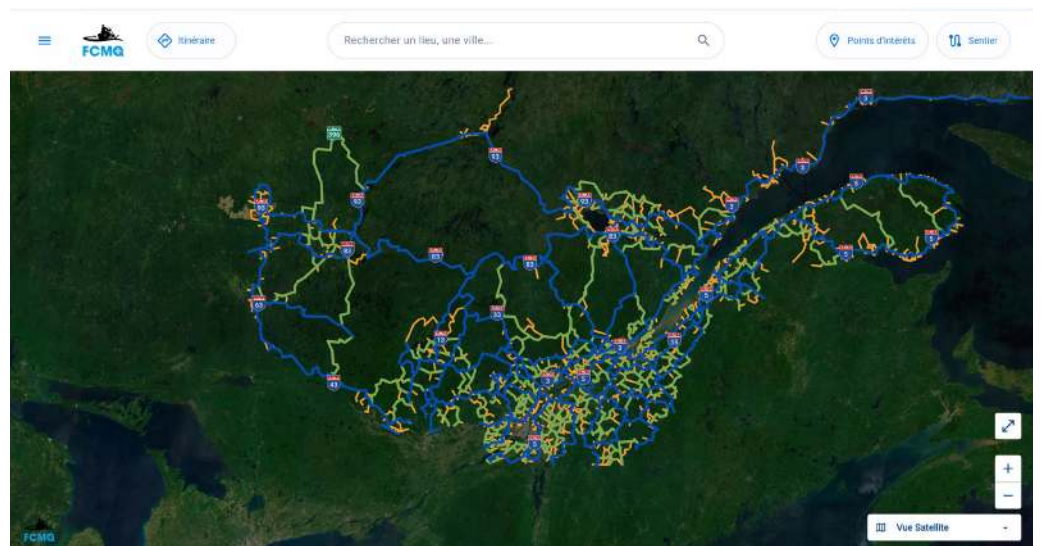
